Sanitation and Protective Gear

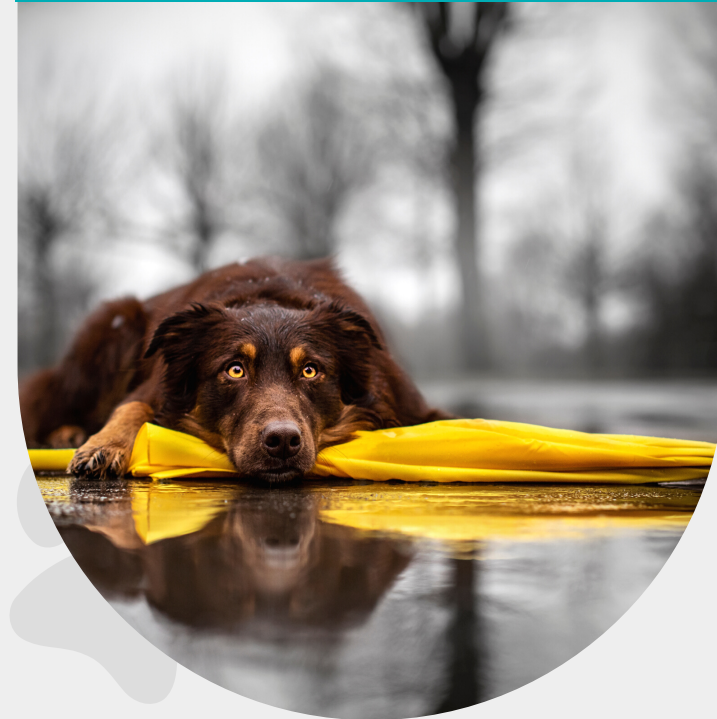
Kitty litter or puppy pads and bags. For clean-up and disposal of waste include gloves, paper towel, rubbish bags and disinfectant.
