- Council will collaborate with service providers, youth supporting organisations and other levels of government to ensure young people in the Derwent Valley have every opportunity to thrive.

POLICY CONTEXT 5.2

This policy is designed to inform Council decisions and actions that concern young people. Its purpose is to ensure that young people have access to opportunities, services, support, and facilities that enable them to participate fully in the community as valued members.

This policy recognises the six domains of the Child and Youth Wellbeing Strategy – It takes a Tasmanian Village, 2021:

- (e) Being loved, safe and valued
- (f) Having material basics
- (g) Being Healthy
- (h) Learning
- (i) Participating
- (i) Having a positive sense of culture and identity

The council has a role to consider these domains when making decisions about outcomes that impact young people in the Derwent Valley.

As a Child and Youth Safe Organisation, the Council operates in accordance with Tasmania's Child and Youth Safe Organisations Framework and the DVC Safeguarding Children and Young People Policy.

5.3 **POLICY PRIORITIES**

The priority areas for Council in supporting youth outcomes are:

- 1. Giving young people a space to have their voices heard.
- 2. Providing safe, inclusive, and respectful spaces for young people to interact.
- 3. Ensuring young people's wellbeing is at the centre of all decision-making.
- 4. Ensure youth services and organisations work in collaboration with each other and Council to provide the best opportunities for young people.
